



Dates Covered: 2011-04-02 to 2011-04-09.

This bulletin reports events information compiled from sms-messages received from multiple representatives of villages in South Kivu under the *Voix des Kivus* pilot project. The *Voix des Kivus* pilot is undertaken by Columbia University to examine the feasibility of using a decentralized SMS platform to obtain high-quality and real-time event data for South Kivu. Data collected through this system represents public event data volunteered by village representatives; it is reported here unedited (except for automated editing to avoid double counting). At the moment there are eighteen *Voix des Kivus* villages but this number is increasing. The completeness or accuracy of this data cannot be guaranteed by the project.

Table 1 This table gives the number of each type of event reported from each location. Identical messages received from different representatives in the same location within 24 hours of each other are treated as single reports.

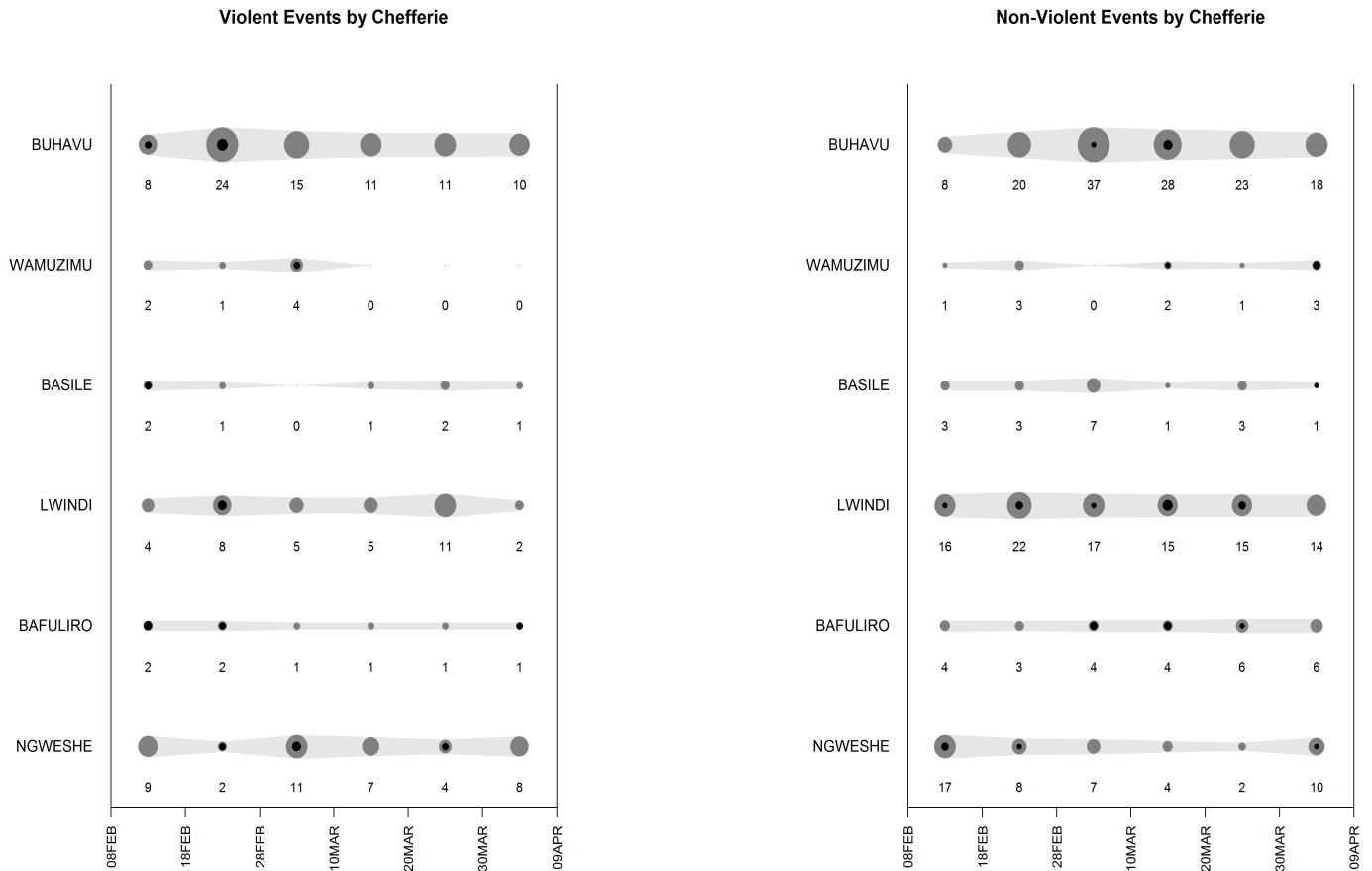
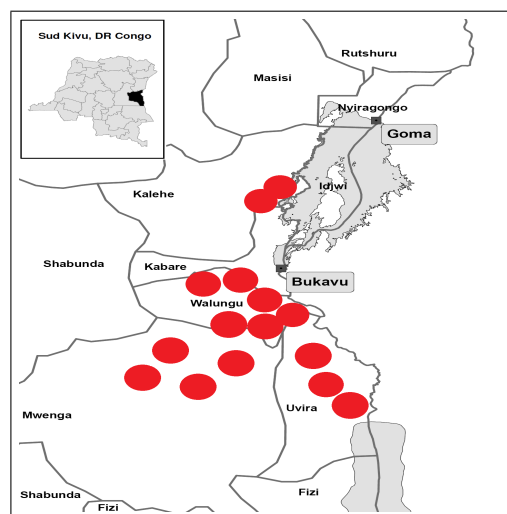


Table 2 Each circle represents the number of events over a period of ten days. The dark circle inside indicates the number of events that have been sent by at least two reporters. Two reports of the same type received within 24 hours of each other from different reporters in the same village are counted as a single event. Event reporting has not been independently verified by *Voix des Kivus*.



Map 1 *Voix des Kivus* operates in eighteen villages in Sud Kivu: Four in Kalehe, six in Walungu, four in Mwenga, and three in Uvira. Note that the red circles are not centered on the villages.
